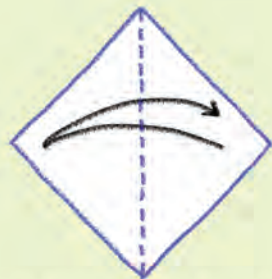
DID YOU KNOW?

In Japan (and other countries like China and Korea), they don't use the same tallying system as us! Instead of IIII, they use 正. You can learn to write it now!

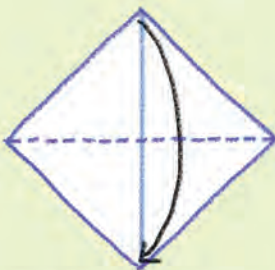

ORIGAMI HOW-TO:

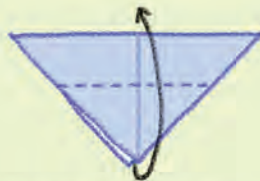
MT. FUJI



1. Make a fold down the centre of the paper along the dotted line



2. Fold over along the dotted line to make a triangle



3. Fold up along the dotted line so that the bottom corner now sticks out at the top



4. Flip the origami over



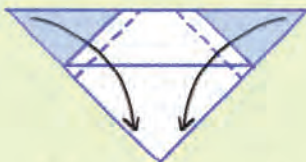
5. Fold along the dotted line so that the top point meets the edge of the paper



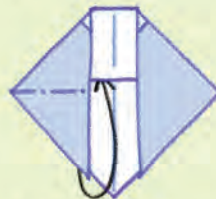
6. Fold the top piece over the edge of the paper



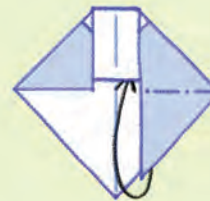
7. Flip the origami over



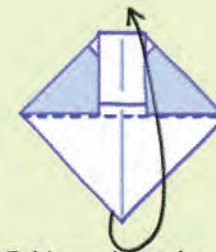
8. Fold the corners down along the dotted lines so that the edges kiss



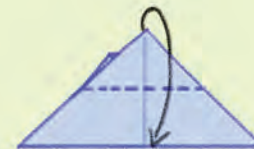
9. Fold the left corner into the gap between the fold above



10. Repeat step 9 on the right side



11. Fold up along the dotted line



12. Fold along the dotted line so that the top corner kisses the edge of the paper



13. Flip the origami over



Now you have your very own Mount Fuji!



Here's what my origami looks like! I used special double sided paper to make it extra すごい

HOW TO:

MAKE A DOUGHNUT WRITING TURRET

I'm not the best at cooking (there's a reason I barely help in the kitchen and it's not just because of the Lava Incident with George), so I came up with a recipe that's easier than easy: recreating my writing turret out of donuts!



You will need:

1 big flat plate
1 medium bowl
1 sieve
250g icing sugar
30ml warm water
1 spoon
24 donuts (or many, many more if you want!)
All the decorations you could dream of!

1. Sift the icing sugar into the bowl
2. Take the warm water and add it gradually to the icing sugar
3. Mix the mixture until the icing is thick enough to coat the back of your spoon
4. Get a big flat plate and coat it in icing in a circular shape
5. Place 5 donuts in a circle on top of the icing
6. Cover the donuts in icing then place 5 more donuts on top
7. Repeat Step 6 so that you have the body of the turret
8. Take 3 donuts, and secure them on top of the tower with icing in a triangle shape in the gaps
9. Repeat with the last 3 donuts
10. If you have more than 24 donuts, save 6 donuts to make the top of the turret, then keep repeating Step 6
11. Decorate your turret!

This secret alphabet makes me feel like we have our own language just for us! But just like we did with English, we need to learn our alphabet so we can talk to each other with it quickly.

So, here's this week's message! What am I trying to tell you?

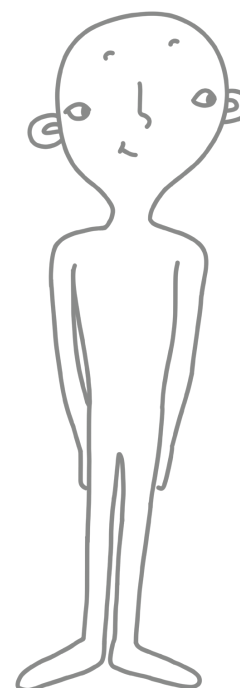
